She worked for several years in the Finance Department and then switched to Planning and served as the City's Planning Technician for almost three years. Next, she served as the Interim City Planner for quite some time before her current appointment. Megan has proven her leadership and passion for planning, and we are excited to her serve in this position.
- Mayor Burris, Councilor Reynolds, Councilor Noffsinger, and I had the opportunity to attend the League of Oregon Cities annual conference at the end of last week. This year it was held in the Eugene, Oregon. All of us were able to attend many great sessions, connect with others in similar positions, and swap ideas with other cities in Oregon. The elected officials that attended provided some updates last night at the Council Meeting on the various things they learned.
- Police Department (TPD):
 - Our Tillamook Police Department has once again applied for and has been awarded a Grant supporting enhanced traffic enforcement patrols. This type of funding is essential and provides more than the City can provide—we thank our Police Department for their hard work in pursuing this grant and many others that are available from time to time.
 - Patrol activities were busy this week. Our patrol officers are working very hard each day to provide the best customer service and response possible with limited resources.
 - Lt. Troxel attended a Statewide Training/Tabletop exercise in response to Line of Duty Deaths of sworn law enforcement in the State of Oregon. Lt. Troxel is a Board Member of the Oregon Fallen Badge Foundation (OFBF). This training was hosted by the Umatilla Sheriff's Office and organized by the OFBF. There were several agencies in attendance (Hillsboro

- The Tillamook County Office of Emergency Management held the annual Winter Preparedness Meeting. Lt. Troxel attended the meeting representing the City. - SC Paving Company has paved 5th Street from Stillwell Avenue to Elm Avenue. They will continue to pave Elm Avenue to Douglas Avenue to complete the 5th Street Improvement Project. To guarantee the community's safety and accelerate the construction process, 5th Street from Elm Avenue to Douglas Avenue will be closed during the paving procedure from 7:00 AM – 7:00 PM beginning Tuesday, October 17th, 2023. We recommend planning as needed due to the limited to no access to this area during the maintenance project. The job is expected to be completed within three days, depending on the weather. Parking spots in front of homes will be inaccessible during construction. Alternative routes and parking will be available on surrounding streets. We ask that local residents use caution at all times until paving is completed and be aware of construction signage, barricades, and moving equipment. We hope to impose as little disruption as possible and will work with you if you have any individual needs.
