 - Lt. Troxel, City Manager George, and Public Work's Assistant Director Fetzer all attended a tour of the City of Vancouver's response to those experiencing houselessness in Vancouver. Their creative and innovative ideas are inspiring. While the City of Tillamook may not have the money to respond at the level Vancouver is responding to, there are ideas and strategies we can explore.
 - This week the rest of the Police Department team attended firearms training in low light and no light situations. This training is always a highlight of the year for firearms training.

- Also last week, Assistant Public Works Director, Kyle Fetzer; Public Works Project Manager, Madelyn Orton; Water Treatment Supervisor, Levi Beachy; and I (City Manager) met with the City's engineers and several representatives of the Port of Tillamook Bay, including the Executive Director, Michelle Bradley, to hold the first of several workshops to help determine the location of the new water transmission main for Phase 1. We are very pleased with the partnership with the Port of Tillamook Bay and look forward to working together on this very important project. Again, we thank Senator Weber for her hard work in obtaining the \$12 Million for this project.
- Yesterday, Lt. Troxel and I attended the Tillamook County
 Coordinated Houseless Collaborative. This group of dedicated
 individuals and organizations are working hard to help find solutions
 for our residents that are experiencing homelessness. We are
 pleased to be a part of this team.
- The City is pleased to announce that we have a new employee in the Planning Department who has filled the position of Planning

- Technician. We welcome Isaac on board and are pleased to again have a full Planning Department.
