- As was previously mentioned this morning, Oregon Senator Jeff Merkley hosted a town hall meeting at the Tillamook Bay Community College (TBCC) this past weekend on Saturday, April 6, 2024. Madelyn Orton, the city's project manager, represented the City at the meeting.
 - Several months ago, the City requested funding from the Senate for the second phase of the water transmission line replacement project. At the meeting, Madelyn expressed how important this project is for the health, well-being, and future of our community.
 - Madelyn also talked about the challenges that rural communities face when it comes to securing federal funding for essential infrastructure projects.
 - She also shared how difficult it is for coastal communities to navigate the complexities of environmental regulations while striving to maintain and upgrade local infrastructure. She asked that the federal government do more to partner with rural coastal communities trying to comply with these elaborate regulations.
 - We greatly appreciate Madelyn's representation and presentation for the City of Tillamook. We also recognize and express appreciation to Lt. Troxel who attended on behalf of law enforcement and to support Madelyn Orton.
