37th Annual Arbor Day Celebration

One requirement to retain our Tree City USA status is to hold an annual Arbor Day celebration. This will entail a tree-planting ceremony at Hoquarton Park.

The Council's recognition highlights the myriad practical benefits trees contribute to the City's well-being, including erosion prevention, air purification, habitat provision for wildlife, and the supply of wood, paper, fuel, and numerous other daily-use products.
