

ORDINANCE NO. 1311

AN ORDINANCE REVISING THE STANDARDS FOR OBSTRUCTION OF STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, AND [THEIR] PERMITTING; AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TILLAMOOK (CCT) TITLE XIII, CHAPTER 130: GENERAL OFFENSES

WHEREAS, the City of Tillamook ("City") had all City Ordinances codified in 2013 for easier reference; and

WHEREAS, the standards for obstruction of streets and sidewalks were reviewed for usage and enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the Tillamook City Council has reviewed the proposed changes to the standards.

NOW THEREFORE, the City of Tillamook ordains as follows:

Section 1: Amendment of the Code of the City of Tillamook (CCT).

The Code of the City of Tillamook (CCT), Title XIII, Chapter 130, Section 21 is hereby amended to include the revisions and additions to the Council Rules as outlined in the attached Exhibit A.

Section 2: Codification.

Provisions of this Ordinance shall amend the Code of the City of Tillamook, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "code", "article", "section", "chapter" or another word and the sections of the Ordinance may be renumbered, or re-lettered, the City Recorder is authorized to correct any cross-references and any typographical errors.

Section 3: Previous Version Replacement.

This code revision replaces all prior versions.

Section 3: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days from the date of adoption.



• **130.21 OBSTRUCTION OF STREETS AND SIDEWALKS; PERMITS.**

(A) No person(s) shall use any City Property, as defined in 71.002, or other public right of way, for the purpose of selling, offering for sale, exhibiting or advertising merchandise, vehicle(s) or any other goods or services, without written permission of the city. No person(s) shall use any city property for any activity, event or use other than obvious intended use, generally indicated by sign or design without written permission of the city. In those cases specifically involving a right of way within the City, a right of way application shall be submitted and approved prior to using any city property. A fee shall be set by resolution for any application, license, and /or permit. Regulations governing the approval of any application, license, and/ or permit may be set by resolution. All permits, licenses, and /or permissions shall be revocable by the city.

(B) No person(s) shall place or deposit upon any city property, city right of way or other public right of way to include but not be limited to sidewalks, streets and alleys, any sign, barricade or other item or article without written permission from the city. A right of way application shall be completed, submitted, approved and all fees paid prior to any sign, barricade, item or article being placed or deposited on any city right of way or city property.

~~(A) No person shall use any of the streets or sidewalks for the purpose of selling, offering for sale, exhibiting or advertising merchandise or other thing which shall cause individual(s) to gather and/or to set up, maintain and operate a stand, table, bench or a parked vehicle for the purpose of conducting the same, on any portion of the streets, sidewalks or other public ways or thoroughfares without first obtaining from the city permission so to do, and any person intending to use any street or sidewalk for the purposes herein enumerated shall first make application to the city for a permit to do so. If the city after consideration of the application, shall consider that the permit shall be granted, the same shall forthwith be issued by the city designating the place, hours and time during which the permit shall be effective. However, the city may charge a fee to be set by resolution for a permit for the activity.~~

~~(B) No person shall place or deposit upon any street or sidewalk any article which obstructs the travel or free passage of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.
