HEAVY CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Note: Under Executive Order (EO) 13658, an hour of \$10.80 for calendar year 2020 applies to all subject to the Davis-Bacon Act for which the contract was awarded (and any solicitation was issued) on or after January 1, 2015. If this contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must pay all workers in any classification list determination at least \$10.80 per hour (or the rate listed on this wage determination, if it is higher than the EO rate) for all hours spent performing on the contract in 2020. If this contract is covered by the EO and a classification is considered necessary for performing the contract does not appear on this wage determination, the contractor must pay workers in that classification the wage rate determined through the conformance procedure in 29 CFR 5.5(a)(1)(ii) (or the EO minimum wage rate, if higher than the conformed wage rate). The EO rate will be adjusted annually. Please note that the above-mentioned types of contracts entered into by the federal government that are subject to the Davis-Bacon Act itself, but it does not apply to contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Related Acts, including those set forth in 29 CFR 5.5(a)(1)(i).

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Note: Executive Order (EO) 13706, Establishing for Federal Contractors applies to all contract Davis-Bacon Act for which the contract is awarded (solicitation was issued) on or after January 1, 2013. If a contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must provide employees with 1 hour of paid sick leave for every day they work, up to 56 hours of paid sick leave each year. Employees must be permitted to use paid sick leave for their own illness, injury or other health-related need; to receive preventive care; to assist a family member (or other close family to the employee) who is ill, injured,

health-related needs, including preventive care resulting from, or to assist a family member (or like family to the employee) who is a victim of violence, sexual assault, or stalking. Additional contractor requirements and worker protection is available at www.dol.gov/whd/govcontracts.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not in the scope of the classifications listed may be awarded only as provided in the labor standards code (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for each cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the determination. The classifications are listed in the order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "UAVG" denotes that the union classification prevailing for that classification in the survey is a union rate. For example, PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation for the union which prevailed in the survey for that classification, which in this example would be Plumbers Local 0198. The 005 indicates the local union number or district code where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The 07/01/2014 is an internal number used for the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect changes in the collective bargaining agreement for this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier where no one rate prevailed for this classification: the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for this classification. As this weighted average rate is based on all the rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SULA2012-007 is the survey rate for the classification of SULA in the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey date for the classifications and rates under this identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier where that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for those classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-001 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 001, in the example, is an internal number used in procedure determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in August, each year, to reflect a weighted average of the negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.
